

Saying Goodbye

Endings are important and can bring up a whole mixed bag of feelings for everyone: sadness, anger, confusion, worry, relief and/or excitement, to name a few. Often we can feel several different feelings at once. As we approach the end of this school year, you may have noticed a change in your child's behaviour: are they more sensitive or reactive than usual? Are they more clingy, having trouble falling asleep or finding separations harder? More meltdowns or outbursts? Or perhaps they have withdrawn a little?

How can parents help?

First, understand that endings may be hard for you too and the end of a school year may bring up all sorts of thoughts and feelings for you. Use this insight to support your child: help them identify those feelings they are feeling and separate them into parts: "It sounds like a part of you is excited for the summer and another part of you is sad to say goodbye to your friends..." Endings are also a great opportunity to reflect back on the year and think together about their favourite times, what would they change/do differently? As much as possible, it is helpful to prepare for the ending so that they have a chance to say goodbye to those (people and places) who matter the most to them: could they create a card for their teacher/friends? Take photos of their favourite places? Create a box or book about this year?



Families are welcome to take one free copy per pupil from Y1 to Y6. The workbooks contain a link to the answers, too.




Morrisons launched the Little Libraries in May, so your local store should have one. Look out for the green signage shown in the picture!

Love the library – all the children have been enjoying visiting the library each week now it has reopened. Although library activities carried on during Covid 19 arrangements, it was a little different. We have so many new books and the children can't wait to check them out each week.

Outdoor reading - in the playground the children have spotted some 'book houses'. Inside these brightly decorated mini houses there are loads of books to read. Children can also choose to read at lunchtime from the trolley in the dining hall and from the book boxes on the field. It's lovely to see groups of children stretching out on large covers on the grass, relaxing with a book.



Year 3 children have once again enjoyed participating in the **Young Readers' project** which is organised by the National Literacy Trust and funded by the Ealing Broadway Shopping Centre. They have each received three free books of their choice and are due to enjoy a *booknic* in the last week of term.

Humanities

We have a Geography project this term for children from Nursery to Y6. All the teachers have planned activities to develop fieldwork and mapping skills. We're making use of our wonderful school site for activities such as creating a map on the field, looking at tube maps, making our own compasses and even links with the Euros for one year group.
