**Re: World Book Day 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2022**

Next week, we are planning a week of exciting activities based around books and reading – we hope to enthuse the love of reading. Children will join in a book cafe activity, buddy reading with different year groups and teachers as well as learning about different authors and how to write book reviews.

On Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March we hope to see everyone in a book related costume! Ideas are down below, however we strongly urge you not to buy a costume but to try and make one or decorate a t-shirt with a cover of a book (you could attach a picture of a book cover to the t-shirt) and make a crown with some of the quotes or words from the story. Why not dress up as an inspirational character that you have read a non-fiction book about? Please bring in the book that your character has come from.

Children will be encouraged to develop our core values through Book Week:

- **Courage:** try a new book from the Book Cafe and dress up on World Book Day
- **Collaboration:** Buddy reading
- **Consideration:** Donate £1.00/50p we will have a collection for the World Book Day charity

All orders placed during our book fair will be delivered to school for free and also school will be able to earn a free book for every five £2.50 books purchased by the parents/carers. **Please do not order yet** (or you'll be charged for delivery) but you can have a look at the amazing titles and we will announce very soon when our Virtual Book Fair has started.

Finally we would love you to get involved in some other fun book related activities, examples are given below:

2. Make a diorama and bring it in to school to display next week.
3. Make a story in a jar and bring it in to school to display week.

We haven't forgotten parents too: the following week we hold parent workshops about reading and look forward to seeing you there.

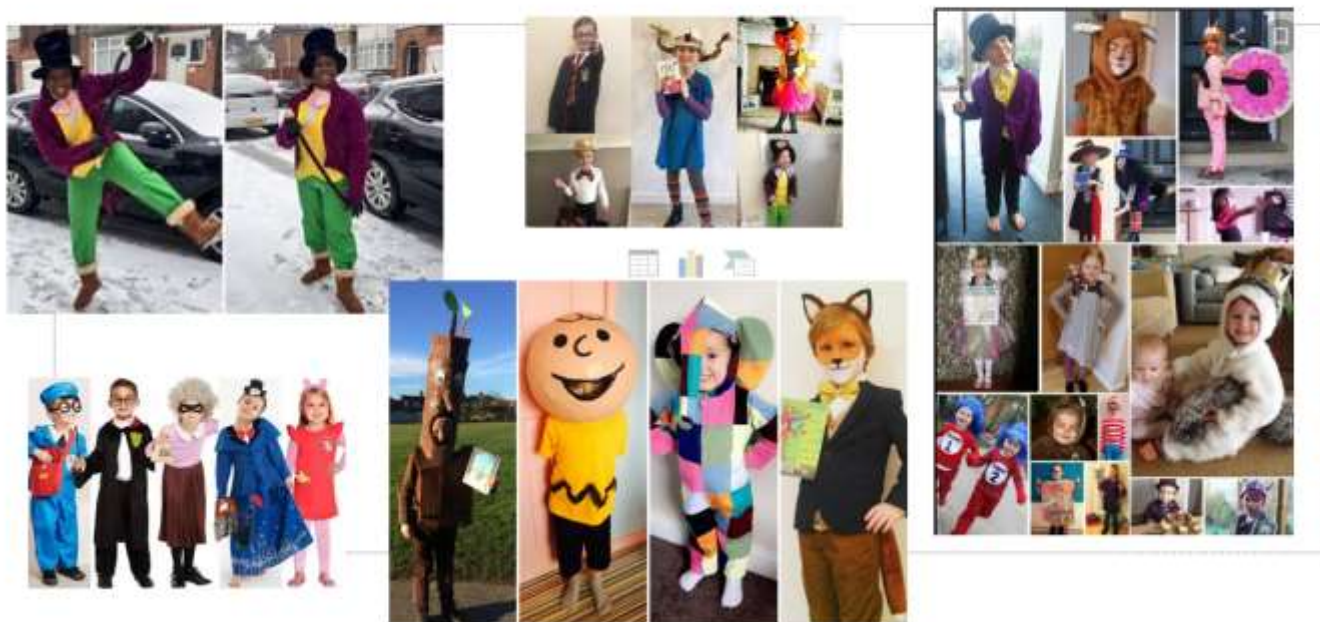
Reading is at the heart of everything in our daily lives – it is so important that our children love reading and books – thank you for supporting us with making sure your child loves reading!
