We want every child to feel safe and secure at West Acton.

The school focuses on a positive reinforcement approach for all learners which is achieved using the following strategies:

- Use of positive praise and instant feedback throughout lessons
- Award of house points for good work, attitude and behaviour
- Celebration of good work using wrist bands
- Celebration of good work displayed on Year 1 celebration wall or on corridor displays.

Library days: Guava (Monday), Ash (Tuesday) and Katsura (Thursday)



- Year 1 children enter school by the small gate where they walk independently to their classroom
- Your child can go straight into class from 8.45am.
- The idea is to provide a safe, calm and structured start to the day.
- Staff will be in class to welcome your child. During this time children normally practise handwriting, spelling or counting activities.



- Reading every night new Reading Record with tips and guidance (to be returned every Wednesday)
- Library book chosen every week (Guava Monday, Ash – Tuesday and Katsura – Wednesday) and to be returned the following week.
- Bug club reading scheme online, a wide variety of books allocated (log ins are the same USOs as provided in Reception)
- Espresso and Purple Mash which have fantastic online resources.
- Spelling booklet (100 high frequency words for Year 1), times table (2x, 5x, and 10x) and handwriting booklet .



- For this year we are planning the following trips to support our learning in class: a local walk, a trip to St Gabriel's church, an open bus tour around London, trip to North Acton playing field and a trip to the seaside.
- We may need your support on school trips as extra adult supervision is very much appreciated.



## How you can help with your child's learning

- Encourage your child to complete the CGP activity books.
- Read daily with your child.
- We will be offering a range of activity clubs that your child can attend after school. Look out for letters every term – most clubs are run on a first come first served basis.



## How do you know about your child's progress

Parent evening appointments will be in person and you will have the opportunity to talk to your class teacher. Further information on how to make an appointment will follow.

- October parents' evening your child will be given their targets for the year during Autumn 1.
- February parents' evening you will be told what level your child is and if they are making expected progress.
- July written report you will be told where your child is in relation to national expectations.

- Please ensure that your child is using ageappropriate games and social media sites - check what games and apps your child is using
- Children are taught e-safety as part of their PSHE lessons.
- Please be mindful of how much time your child is spending using computers, iPads or phones - limit their time
- Take laptops/ iPads etc out of their room at night
- Don't post photos in school uniform



It is very important that your child arrives at school on time so that they do not miss out on vital learning time.

It is just as important that you are on time to collect your child at the end of the day. If there is any delays or someone different picking up your child please inform the office.

It is also very important that your child gets a good night's sleep. Children of 5 and 6 years old should have at least 10-11 hours of sleep per night.

It is essential that they have a healthy breakfast before coming to school.




If you have any concerns please let your child's <u>class teacher or Mr Humble</u> know straight away so we can respond sooner rather than later.
