Year 4 Swimming

Mulberry Sycamore and Pine class will go swimming for Autumn Term and half of Spring Term. This will commence on the week commencing 12th September 2022.

The lessons will be held at the swimming pool at **Everyone Active Acton**. Mulberry and Sycamore class will leave school after morning break, Pine will leave after the morning register. They will be taken and brought back to the swimming pool by coach.

Please ensure that your child brings their swimming kit to school every **MONDAY** (Mulberry), TUESDAY (Sycamore) or WEDNESDAY (Pine) in a clearly labelled bag – it may be easier for your child to wear their costume under their PE kit on this day. This includes:

- towel
- swimming costume or swimming trunks (not baggy shorts or bikini)
- swimming hat must be worn
- goggles (optional)

PE Kit

- Year 4 PE lessons are on every Thursday
- Children come to school wearing their full PE kit on Thursdays
- Send a labelled water bottle in with your child EVERY day
- In line with BOROUGH POLICY, no jewellery is allowed to be worn apart from small stud earrings. Long hair MUST be tied up and out of their faces.
