Dear Parents/carers,

It was lovely to see so many of you at the coffee morning yesterday. To be able to wish you a Happy New year, to speak to so many of you face to face and to think with you about how we can support children and young people's emotional wellbeing.

We focused on thinking about children's thoughts and feelings and in particular what we can do to help our child/children, with their feelings.

Emotion regulation is the ability to manage our emotions. Emotion regulation is also known as emotional self-regulation.

There are lots of emotions that we all experience such as happy, sad, and angry plus others. We experience these emotions in response to our thoughts and feelings and because of what is happening around us.

Emotion regulation is important because our emotions are closely connected to how we think and feel. Our thoughts and feelings help us to decide how to respond to a situation and what actions to take. In other words, our thoughts and feelings influence our behaviour.

How can parents/carers help?

When supporting your child to regulate their emotions, you need to be aware of; your own emotions, your reaction to these emotions, and how they may affect your child's emotions (also known as co-regulation).

When you are feeling calm, you are in a better place to help them with their feelings and you can use your presence and calm to reset your child's distressed brain. Try these steps;

Get close, make eye contact, listen, be curious and seek to understand, show empathy, listen again and check you have heard correctly before offering some warm affection. Remember, a hug goes a long way.
