Teachers' Strike Action

Further to my notice in the newsletter last week regarding the news that the National Education Union (NEU) have declared strike action, I need to inform you that our school will be **closed for all pupils (Nursery to Year 6) on Wednesday 1**st **February 2023.** We are asking you not to send your child into school on this day.

The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over National Funding and Pay Campaign and the Anti-Trade Union Laws and not because of any issues at our school.

I have not taken this decision lightly. We remain committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our pupils, and feel that we would be unable to provide this with the limited staff we have available.

I am sorry that you will have to make alternative arrangements for your child at short notice, and that they will experience disruption to their education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect.

The NSPCC is encouraging schools across the UK to take part in their Number Day - a maths inspired fundraising day. On Friday 3rd February, we are asking children to wear number themed clothes - whether they dress up as a calculator, wear a football shirt with a number on the back – or even decorate an old t-shirt with lots of different calculations! We will be having inspirational speakers visiting year groups too to talk about the world of work.



We encourage donations between 50p - £1.00, with funds raised from Number Day going to help support vital NSPCC services such as Speak out. Stay Safe, which visits primary schools across the UK to teach children about the dangers of abuse and what they can do if they need help.



On Thursday, our Year 5 and Year 6 boys' football team played John Perryn School in the Peal Shield competition. We built on our previous two matches with a more solid defensive display, but ran out of stream in the closing stages. A special mention to our goalkeepers, Parsa and Hamed, who made a number of breath-taking saves. Our man of the match was Keion who put in some tough tackles and played the ball out from the back very well despite being under constant pressure. Well done boys!

Cut Your Carbon will be take place from the 6th to the 10th of February




