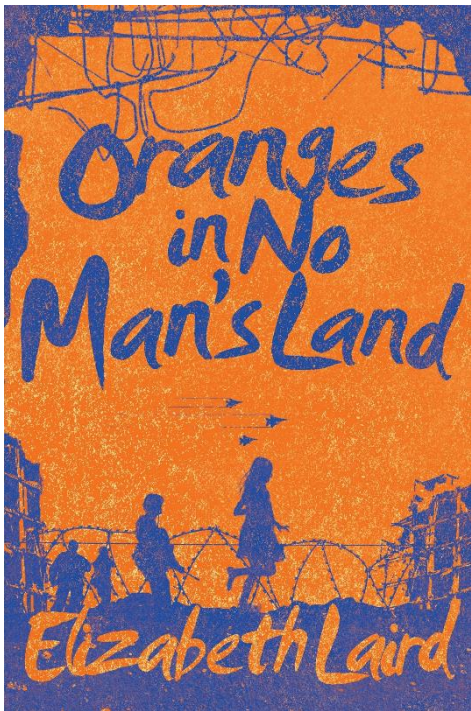


Dear Parent/Carer,

This is what is says on the back of the book,

Ayesha lives in a battle-scarred building with her granny and her little brothers. Outside, a war is tearing the city apart – but Ayesha doesn't know why the two sides are fighting.

Life gets even scarier when Granny falls ill, and Ayesha has no choice but bravely to embark on the dangerous journey across no man's land for medicine. Will she be able to find a doctor and make it back before it's too late.

It is a gripping story of a girl risking death to make a lifesaving dash through wartorn Beirut. *Oranges in No Man's Land* tells the riveting story of ten-year-old Ayesha's terrifying journey across *no man's land* to reach a doctor in hostile territory in search of medicine for her dying grandmother.

If possible, it would be really helpful for your child to have this book to read in class during this half-term.
