#### MESSAGE from Mrs Ahmad, School Therapist

Nurturing family connections through mealtimes...

Often dinnertime can feel like hard work, a mission that you just want to get through. However studies show that having dinner together as a family is a top predictor for how well children will do in school and in adolescence. The ritual of sharing food with those we love offers children the security of belonging, being nurtured and a space to talk and share.

How can parents/carers help?

Try to have at least a few nights a week when you can all eat together. Keep that space sacred, safe and positive and, most importantly, switch off the TV and all devices-including your own phones! It is helpful to keep dinner fun and playful and to engage everyone in preparing the meal/and or setting the table. Think of rituals you can put in place and try to make the discussions interesting for everyone. And the first secret is to keep the food healthy but simple: look after yourself and save your energy for connecting with your family.

We also give you some information about venues where your daily admission can be converted to an annual pass at no additional cost. We hope there is something for everyone to enjoy!

#### SPOTLIGHT ON: The Elizabeth Line

Having recently celebrated its 1st Birthday, the Elizabeth Line provides travel to the West and East of London in style. The route passes through the borough stations of Southall, Hanwell, West Ealing, Ealing Broadway and Acton Mainline and stops at some amazing locations offering free and low-cost activities for your family to enjoy during May Half Term.

You can try Free Mini Golf Minigalf by Craig & Karl -Canary Wharf, Free Childrens' Art Trail Children's Art Trail - Canary Wharf and a Free Family Film Club Family

Film Club - Canary Wharf which can all be found a short walk from Canary Wharf station.

Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park has become a hub for sport, education, entertainment, and more. There's plenty to explore throughout the space, including live music, theatre, sport, and arts. Visitors can also try out sports activities throughout the park's facilities. So, whether you want to dive in the same pool Tom Daley has, or dance along to Mamma Mia with ABBA, this park has got it all. Which station? Walpole Park - Free (Get off at <u>Ealing Broadway station</u>) For something a bit quieter and closer to home, <u>Walpole Park</u> is the perfect spot for a picnic, or walk, set among beautifully landscaped parkland. While you're there, you can also visit the <u>Pitzhanger Manor & Gallery</u>, featuring work by contemporary artists, designers and architects. Check website in advance for free resident sessions and range of workshops and activities for children, families and adults. Entrance is free to Ealing residents on Sunday mornings and all day Wednesday.

Also, closer to home, **Hanwell Zoo** is a popular attraction located in Brent Lodge Park in Hanwell, London W7.
